2. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or had received from the Department pursuant to the institution’s Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grant to Student:

\$83,129 (this has yet to be released to the school as of 9-21-2020)

3. The Total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act of the date of submission

\$83,129 will be distributed to the students as soon as the funds are received from the Department of Education. As of this reporting, 9-21-2020, funds have not been released to the school.

SHN CAREER COLLEGE, INC dba CALIFORNIA CAREER COLLEGE has approximately 162 students (as of this report) eligible to participate in the Federal Student financial aid program and thus are eligible to receive HEERF under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

5. The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

As of this reporting, there are 0 (zero) number of students who have received Emergency Financial Aid Grant. This is because the money has not been sent and/or deposited to the account on record as of this date – Sept 22, 2020

6. The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

Students who are currently enrolled in 2020 and have filed for their FAFSA in 2020 will receive this grant. The amount of \$83,129 will be equally divided amongst these students. Sample calculation as follows:

$\$83,129 / \text{number of students enrolled in 2020} = \text{Amount of Emergency grant}$
